	Regional Committee Reports
West	Imran Farooq – this was the first meeting that Heidi attended and we introduced her to the members. I gave an update on i-Hub. Riverside did not receive a designation from Commerce for the Investing in Manufacturing Communities Partnerships (IMCP). Los Angeles County and University State of California (USC) received the designation which gives them priority for \$1.3 billion in funding. Riverside is in conversations with LAC/USC and the discussions have some tangible outcomes for our area. We should have results from these conversations to report by August.
East	Juan De Lara – The East Committee group has been holding their WIB meetings meeting at different locations. At our last meeting we had a presentation from Desert Enterprise Energy Center. We had a success story from one of our WDC customers. We have a workgroup that puts together our meeting agendas. We continue to give presentations as we are requested. Some of our presentations have been televised locally. We did an update on the hospitality industry, which we will present later.
Southwest	Members asked if the Southwest Committee could create some workforce activities to senior job seekers. We will present this request at the July committee meeting in Southwest.

## Mary Jo Ramirez The CYD has aligned its meetings so that our members can now attend the WIB Regional Committee meetings and be the expert voice for the youth at the regional level. Members report out on outcomes at the CYD quarterly meetings. This will help the CYD stay aligned with the WIB's goals and activities for youth. Character Counts – the Jamil Dada Youth Award for Excellence honored 6 youths. We raised \$16,750 in sponsorships and grants. The BOS and legislators gave certificates and presentations.

# Federal and State Report The reauthorization of the Workforce Investment Act is moving forward with bipartisan support. The new act is called the Workforce Innovation and Opportunity Act. The reauthorization may be passed by both houses in the summer and then sent to the President. Some of the items in the act are: Shrinking the size of the Boards Private sector lead Funding allocation good for three or possibly five years. Economic and education focused State role will remain the same Performance measures will be required This bill is endorsed by many leading groups in Washington. The California Workforce Investment Board June 18, 2014, and the Green Collar meetings have been cancelled.

	workforce website and she asked members to let staff know what types of information they would like to see on
	the report.
	She told members that workforce's grant development staff is pursuing large grants one are a \$6 to \$11 million dollars that addresses long-term unemployed.
	Integration of efforts within EDA is occurring to merge some staff efforts of Economic Development, Workforce and Housing. Members expressed concerns regarding the possible merging of workforce funds with economic dollars. Heidi explained that funding must be allocated to specific uses, they cannot be misused or blended
	together.
