	Council for Youth Development (CYD) Report
Rosa Penaloza	Our last meeting was February 9, 2011, and we welcomed 3 new members. We received a presentation from a representative of SMART Education (Science Math And Robotic Technology). They would like to partner with us to expand their services to Riverside county youth. They are a nonprofit organization from the Coachella Valley and their goal is to provide scholarships and opportunities to youth in the fields of math, science, robotics and renewable energy. Legislative and Advocacy Taskforce: Met on January 12, 2011, and their focus will be on further plans for the youth advocacy group by presenting statics and creating outlines for a position paper to distribute out into the region. Create a fully drafted position

paper for the CYD in behalf of the youth and focus on our out of school youth.
On February 14 <sup>th</sup> the Youth Advocacy Group gave a presentation to Supervisors Marion Ashley and Jeff Stone. They developed and presented their own research and position paper. They emphasized the needs that youth have and how the Youth Opportunity Centers (YOC)s are instrumental in helping youth succeed in life. They also highlighted the teen pregnancy issue, which is countywide and employment opportunities for youth. After the presentation, Supervisor Stone challenged them to become greater than what they are. Rosa will have copies of their report at the next meeting. The group is scheduled to go to Sacramento on March 15, 2011. They are preparing for the trip.

	National Associations of Workforce Board Chairman's Report
Jamil Dada	The Appropriations Committee and the Continuing Resolutions (CR) have decided to have deep cuts which will eliminate many programs and WIA is in the group. Jamil gave a breakdown of how funding is usually distributed to the various programs. WIA funding is approximately \$3.2 billion for the coming year. The WIA program does work the 2,200 One Stop Centers run by the 580 Boards served over 8 million people and around half of these people found work.
	Jamil met with Congressman Buck McKeon, who is spear heading the WIA reauthorization and John Kline, Chair of the Non Executive Committee. Many of the legislators are saying, if the House does pass the cuts the Senate will oppose it. NAWB is requesting that at least f 400 of the 580 WIBs ask their Chair and Vice Chairmen and their 12,000 private sector members to send letters saying WIA cannot be shut down. The Legislators need to hear from business and jobseekers who have been helped by our services.
	The California Workforce Association is working with the WIBs to get the work out. Virginia Hamilton requested key CWA members to send in projects, letters from business customers for Senator George Miller's team. We submitted two letters and some faxes from our customers for their use.
