SUMMARY: The Service Coordinator I - Outreach is a member of the Homeless Services Coordination team located in the County of Riverside. Primary tasks include street outreach and engagement, transportation, housing linkage, and ongoing case management services with individuals experiencing homelessness in Riverside County.

DUTIES: Primary areas of responsibility include, but are not limited to the following:

- Engages persons without homes to initiate contact, develop rapport, and assess individuals for service needs.
- Complete the homeless survey tool, VI-SPDAT on all homeless individuals encountered to determine severity of need. Submit tool results to local CES for entry and housing match.
- Evaluate for immediate needs such as crisis intervention, medical attention, showers, clothing, food, emergency shelter, etc. Evaluate for appropriate triage or linkage to housing, health, and financial resources to help resolve homelessness and refer to community partners.
- Engage assigned clients to achieve their goals and objectives and report to the team and clinically qualified staff regarding changes clients of level of functioning, support networks, adequacy of living arrangements, financial status, physical health, level of self-care.

- Work in collaboration with other local outreach teams to schedule collaborative outreach events to provide whole person care in the field.
- Provide transportation to support stabilization efforts.
- Maintain member files in compliance with funder requirements.
- Assist with the collection of data, and submission of quarterly/annual reports.
- Attend Step Up staff meetings and trainings as requested.
- Coordinate with City Departments such as Library, Police, Fire, Public Defender, Parks and Recreation to support, assist with homeless population education to staff and linkage to services.
- Track all engagements and services rendered in HMIS.

SKILLS:

- Knowledge of or experience with mainstream benefits and services competencies such as Critical Time Intervention, Motivational Interviewing, Trauma Informed Care, Housing First, Harm Reduction, etc.
- Ability to work collaboratively with others and on a team.
- Initiative and solution focused practice.
- Uses good time management skills and resources to balance case load direct service and paperwork.
- Works within skills and scope of practice asking for support and training to improve abilities when needed.
- Ability to work as a team member on the streets, in homeless facilities or with other homeless community providers such as police, churches and hospital ER's.
- Ability to engage individuals on the streets in a meaningful manner which imbues trust enough to accept services offered.
- Understands and promotes safety first to self and team members.

QUALIFICATIONS: 1 year of related work experience working with homeless population. Case management experience is essential, including the ability to chart patient progress to meet documentation requirements. Candidate must have own transportation and current California driver's license and insurance. Position requires occasional driving and transporting with either company or personal vehicles whichever may be available for use. Must be fully vaccinated for Covid-19.

SUPPLEMENTAL INFORMATION: Work with people experiencing homelessness whether on the streets, in shelters or other places of habitation or services, may present inherent challenges and difficulties such as: exposure to bed bugs or other infestations, unpleasant smells or odors, individuals who may have poor hygiene or unclean homes due to homelessness, mental health symptoms, or poverty. Additionally, in working with our members, employees may encounter instances of profanity, sexually explicit or derogatory language, or verbal or physical expressions of anger and trauma. Very rarely do these situations ever escalate to physical contact, and negative or derogatory communication patterns can often be negotiated successfully. All direct care staff are provided adequate training to develop skills to deescalate crisis situations that may arise and Step Up has established procedural safeguards for all employees to mitigate (but not eliminate) these inherent risks of employment.

PHYSICAL REQUIREMENTS: While performing the duties of this job, the employee is regularly required to sit; use hands and fingers; handle or feel; reach with hands and arms; talk; and hear. The employee is

frequently required to walk, balance, stoop, kneel, and/or crouch. The employee must occasionally lift and/or move up to 15 pounds. Specific vision abilities required by this job include close vision, distance vision, peripheral vision, depth perception, and ability to adjust focus. Keyboard data entry required.

Step Up utilizes the principles of trauma-informed care and mental health recovery. These principles inform our Core Values of Hope, Wellness, Voice and Choice, Respect, and Collaborative Relationships. As representatives of Step Up, employees agree to adhere to these values in their interactions with members, colleagues, supervisors, and associated community members.

ChildNet Youth and Family Services is currently recruiting for a Client Support Services Counselor (CSSC) for our Inland Empire (IE) Behavioral Health Services program located in Riverside, CA.

IE Behavioral Health Services provides various support services to Foster Family Network (FFN) foster children, resource parents and their natural families as well as community-based clients. The Client Support Services Counselor (CSSC) provides regular support services to Intensive Services Foster Care (ISFC) placed clients, resource parents and families in the community, in collaboration with other members of the ISFC and/or mental health treatment team. The CSSC will be assigned to serve high-risk youth and work within the community, coordinating services needed to meet the needs of clients and their families. All services are provided according to county contracts and in compliance with agency policies and procedures and state requirements. Work hours may begin and end at various intervals throughout the day. **Work days may include Saturdays and Sundays**, and two consecutive days off during the 40 hour work week are not guaranteed. Position requirements include a work schedule not consistent with eight (8) straight scheduled hours of working time. If a business-related call is received between work functions or between intervals of working time, it is expected that an attempt will be made to return the call within 30 minutes.

The CSSC responsibilities include, but are not limited to, the following:

- Coordinate and provide services, including IHBS/Rehab and TBS services to children and adolescents under the supervision of the CSSC Supervisor or their designee. This will frequently involve one-to-one interaction with a specific client for extended periods.
- Meet with clients regularly, and as often as necessary, to provide opportunities to practice new skills to support them in their home and in various community environments and situations.
- Meet level of service requirements according to the needs of each child identified as requiring services on the client treatment plan.
- Maintain availability for possible crisis intervention services 24 hours/day, 7 days/week.
- Attend and participate in CFT, IEP, consult meetings, and other client-related meetings as part of the treatment implementation team.
- Complete assessments, reports and other required paperwork for timely submission to county placing agencies.
- Maintain contact notes and DMH billing documentation for each individual client.

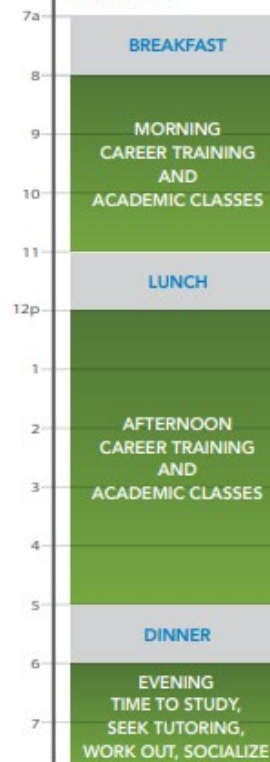

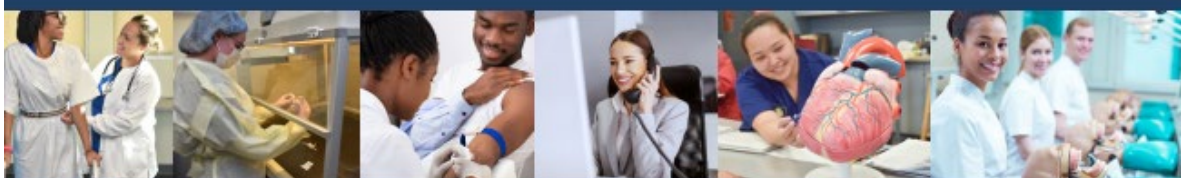

Registration for Citizenship, ESL, GED and High School Diploma classes
The registration process is as follows:

1. Complete the online registration form here: bit.ly/RASCLASS which will be open February 6 - 10th
2. You will receive an email within 2-3 days of completing the registration form with information about how to schedule your testing appointment. **An in person CASAS test is required** in order to register for either in person or online ESL/GED or High School Diploma classes at Riverside Adult School. (Students registering for the high school diploma program must submit an unofficial copy of their high school transcript during registration. Please request your record from your high school now to ensure you have the transcript for registration.) Testing appointments will be the week of February 13-16.
3. Attend your in person testing appointment. You will select your class schedule and indicate whether you would like to attend class in person or online during your testing appointment.
4. You can begin classes once your in person test is completed.

ESL/English as a Second Language

ESL courses give English learners opportunities to study and practice English language communications skills, including listening, speaking, reading, writing, and critical thinking. Competency-based courses span seven levels ranging from basic literacy to advanced English language development.

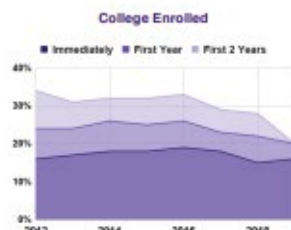

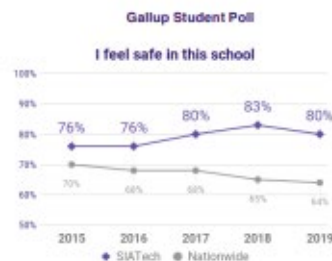

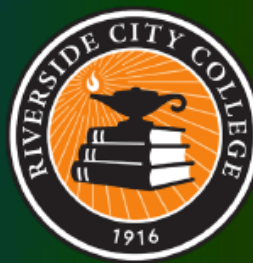

What is LIHWAP?

The Low Income Household Water Assistance Program (LIHWAP) is a temporary emergency program to help low-income families with assistance on past due and current water and sewer bills, up to \$2,000. LIHWAP is a grant. You do not have to repay it.

To receive help, you must:

- Be a Riverside County resident.
- Submit a complete application.
- Meet the income guidelines.

How do I apply?

Call the Riverside County Community Action Partnership at (951) 955-4900 to request an application. If you apply for LIHEAP now, it will pre-qualify you for LIHWAP. You may apply for LIHEAP online at www.capriverside.org.

To apply you will need:

- Names of the people in your household.
- Picture ID, proof of citizenship, and social security card of person applying.
- Last 4 weeks of income for all household members.
- Water/sewer bill.

Additional eligibility:

If you receive CalWORKS, CalFresh and/or received LIHEAP within the last 4 months, you will automatically qualify for LIHWAP.

Your water system must be enrolled in the Direct Pay Program to receive payment from us.

- Proof of household income (last 4 weeks)
- Photo ID and social security card
- Birth certificate, US passport, or proof of legal residency

With the new Hire MoVal – Hire a MoVal Veteran program, Moreno Valley businesses are eligible to receive incentives for hiring Moreno Valley Veterans, who are residents and have served in active military, naval or air service in the United States. Local businesses may be awarded a \$1,000 stipend for each recent Moreno Valley Veteran up to a maximum of five new hires once employed a minimum of six months and at least 20 hours per week on average.

IN ORDER TO BE ELIGIBLE, MORENO VALLEY BUSINESSES MUST:

- ✓ Have a current business license
- ✓ Hire a Moreno Valley Veteran resident who has received a Honorable Discharge, released from active duty under honorable conditions and served a minimum of 90 consecutive days or was released from active duty under honorable conditions.
- ✓ Veterans must provide copies of discharge papers (DD-214)
- ✓ Employed a minimum of six months and at least 20 hours per week on average
